Kingston Mosaic's mission is to bring an inclusive and holistic curriculum for children with special needs to the Kingston area. Mosaic stands for "Meaningful Opportunities, Social Awareness, and Inclusive Culture". This registered non-profit organization offers curative and educational programs based on Waldorf education principles that foster the well-rounded development of each child.

Inspired by the Camphill Movement, Mosaic's long-term vision is to create a full-time school as well as community-based living projects for people with special needs of all ages.

Mosaic has offered regular PD day programs and summer camps since 2015. Providing the programs at low cost is a priority for us in order to make Kingston Mosaic accessible to all families.

Many of the children attending Kingston Mosaic face barriers to participation in a typical camp of school setting. Our calm and structured environment as well as our small staff to student ratio allow these children to feel comfortable and fully engage with the group. They leave our programs feeling more confident and with new friends, a huge step for many.

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BACKGROUND

Kingston Mosaic is inspired by the Camphill Movement which is an international network of therapeutic communities for individuals with special needs.

Austrian pediatrician, Karl Koenig, founded the first Camphill community in Scotland during the second world war for children in need of special care. He envisioned a village-like community where the unique traits of every individual would be seen as enriching and meaningful. Based on the philosophy of Rudolph Steiner, the Camphill schools use an adapted Waldorf curriculum.

Today, there are more than 100 Camphill communities in 22 countries around the world. They provide schools, living spaces, and work places in rural and urban settings, often complete with farms, markets, cafes, and community centres. In these active communities, children and adults with special needs are guaranteed a place to live, learn, work, and feel welcome and appreciated.



CURRENT PROGRAMS

Kingston Mosaic's PA day programs and summer camps involve art, music, drama, story telling, free play, cooking, baking, outdoor activities, and more. All activities aim to help children develop their motor skills (hands), their social and emotional skills (heart), their intellectual functioning (mind), and foster independent living skills and social connections.

Our amazing teachers, a warm and welcoming environment, coupled with Waldorf inspired pedagogy, make these days meaningful and fun for the children and youth.

Our summer camps also include daily workshops with local artists, as well as theatrical and musical performances by the students.
